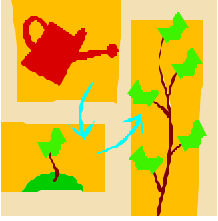


Planting and Caring for Your Seed



1. Poke a hole in the bottom of each cup to let excess water drain out while your seeds are growing.
2. Fill each cup about $\frac{3}{4}$ full with potting soil. Place the seed in the middle and cover it with about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of soil.
3. Before you water your seeds, take them home (or wherever they're going to grow).
4. Place your seed container in a saucer, and moisten the soil with water.
5. Set where direct sunlight will keep the seed warm while it germinates or sprouts in 4-6 weeks.
6. Add a little water whenever the surface of the soil seems dry. Be careful not to over water or disturb the seed.
7. When the seed's little head pops out, it is a seedling! You can keep it indoors (away from air conditioning drafts) or outdoors in a protected place like your porch for the first few months.

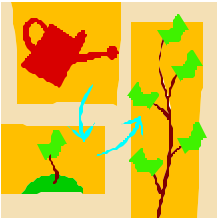
Remember that your tree is not a house plant. Put it outside in a protected place when it is 3 inches tall, so it can start getting used to the great outdoors where you will eventually set it free.

Planting and Caring for Your Seed

6. Add a little water whenever the surface of the soil seems dry. Be careful not to over water or disturb the seed.
7. When the seed's little head pops out, it is a seedling! You can keep it indoors (away from air conditioning drafts) or outdoors in a protected place like your porch for the first few months.

Remember that your tree is not a house plant. Put it outside in a protected place when it is 3 inches tall, so it can start getting used to the great outdoors where you will eventually set it free.
